The only female news editor in South Sudan, Anna has been reporting for more than 15 years enduring attacks, imprisonment and routine censorship by the government. In 2016, she single-handedly reopened her paper and released her editor from prison.

Anna and Nastya work to expose government corruption despite enduring threats since the Maidan Revolution began. Anna has been attacked by the government while Nastya has been taken hostage and detained.

Liz’s 37 years in journalism have rendered her fearless, despite constant government surveillance. Most recently she has covered the war in Syria and has reported in a country where nearly 130 journalists have been killed to date.
